






Overview: Spatial Futures Initiative

"The origins of property rights in the United States are rooted in racial domination."

- Cheryl Harris

- Housing and land exclusion are racialized in nature, sewn into the very fabric of our institutions, policies, and value systems.
- In order to transform this reality, we need to address historical and persistent spatial injustices.

What would our futures look like if space were oriented toward justice??





Defining Reparative Spatial Justice

A transformative approach to rectify historical and ongoing injustices in the allocation and use of space, housing, and land. Aimed at reconfiguring spaces where historically marginalized communities can reclaim their connection to land and gain restitution for enduring racist policies and practices.

- Aspirational, world-building
- Transformative rather than reformist
- Community driven and place-based







Goals: Spatial Futures Initiative


- Expose the entrenched racial inequities in this country's existing land use and housing policies
- Generate recommendations and resources to support systemic change
- Develop and support research and maintain a comprehensive list of policies and projects for reparative spatial justice
- Craft and implement powerful narratives to reframe and propel the national discourse on reparative spatial justice








About Policy & Program Database Resources Fellowship

Fellowship Overview







SFF Cohort 1

- Ten fellows advancing reparative spatial justice projects
- Collective questions:

How can we structure our relationships to land and housing around care and stewardship while still navigating our current system and protecting our claim to space and community?







Spatial Futures Fellows Goals

- Provide support and resources to fellows in their efforts to reclaim and repair land that has been stolen, polluted, or otherwise damaged by systems of oppression.
- Explore models of land stewardship models that draw on the knowledge and practices of Black and Indigenous communities, emphasizing mutual care, respect for the land, and sustainable practices that honor ancestral knowledge.
- Elevate reparative spatial justice in local, state, and national policy conversations.
- Contribute to the development of model policies, case studies, and campaign pathways that reflect the principles of reparative spatial justice.
- Build a body of knowledge and practice around reparative spatial justice to share with other communities working towards similar goals.





Deliverables

- Create, develop, and socialize a policy and strategy framework for reparative spatial justice, designed to influence policymaking at state, local, and federal levels.
- Contribute to the growth of the Spatial Futures digital platform. This platform will coordinate
 and disseminate model policies, best practices, readings, blogs, narrative strategies, and
 stories, serving as a hub for recruiting and mobilizing additional leaders and supporters of the
 movement.

Learning Arc:

- Months 1-6: Relationship Building, Learning, and Framework Understanding
- Months 7-13: Policy Framework Development
- Months 14-18: Policy Framework Development and Dissemination



Resources

- \$15,000 stipend
 - Can be paid to individual or organization
 - Eligibility: Must have SSN and be located in the U.S.
- Mentorship and thought-partnership from expert advisors
- Learning community of peers working toward reparative justice in land and housing

Commitments

- Fellows will be expected to commit up to 10 hours per month for this fellowship.
 - Meet twice monthly
 - 2-hour monthly cohort learning sessions
 - 1-hour monthly working meetings
- Up to an additional 4-6 hours of required reading or independent research and writing.
- In-person convening in April 2025
- Contribute to the publication of a reparative spatial justice policy framework





Who should apply?

- You are working in your community to reckon with, repair, and transform the legacies of racist land and housing policies.
- You are working in policy, or at the intersections of policy change, to advance reparative spatial justice.
- You are working a broader institution or community organization that supports your full participation in the fellowship, or can demonstrate capacity to participate fully in the program.
- You are committed to building intersectionality and cross-movement solidarity to advance reparative spatial justice.






Important Dates

- Dec 2-6, 2024: Interview period
- Dec 19, 2024: Final decisions announced via email
- Feb 2025: Cohort begins
 - Cohort will run from February 2025 to August 2026.
