Indigenous + Afrodiasporan Ways of Knowing


- Recognize oral traditions, storytelling, and communal wisdom as vital forms of knowledge.
- Challenge dominant narratives by validating diverse cultural perspectives in spatial planning.
- Emphasize emotional, spiritual, and cultural dimensions in spatial justice, beyond physical and economic reparations.
- Foster spaces and spatial dynamics that heal and empower, reflecting the community's holistic needs and aspirations.



- Applying liberatory frameworks (abolition, afrofuturism) to housing and land justice with new models vs. reconfigured systems
- Invoking Black, Indigenous and Brown spatial and temporal imaginaries in how you structure engagement
- Reimagining the ways that we collaborate with impacted people and communities and Co-developing new solutions outside of the crisis-response model
