
### **Overview of HCZ**

# Holistic Model to HS, College, Career and Life Readiness






#### **Key Program Activities**

- Tutoring, test prep, college visits


### Our College Retention Strategy Has Been Effective

#### **Transition is Key**

- During students' senior year, CSO collaborates with high school sites and their College Coordinates to support their college transition.

## **College Success Office (CSO)**



### How we do it:

- Academic: tutoring, study skills and academic behaviors workshops
- Advocacy: help to navigate financial aid, re-admittance, transfer processes
- *Financial:* scholarships, emergency funds
- Personal & Social Development: counseling services, peer social groups, community service
- Career: job readiness workshops, paid summer internships, career exposures

#### **Common Obstacles we are Working to Address**


- Lack of academic preparedness
- Insufficient college-level academic behaviors (ex., study skills, time management)
- Inadequate financing
- Involvement in risky behaviors
- Coping with personal or family crises
- Misunderstanding of key college processes (ex., selection of major) as many are first-generation college students

# **Developing Proactive Supports: Bard Early College Program**



	Bard Early College Program	
Description:	An accelerated high school program where students earn up to 60 transferable college credits	
Program Goal:	To increase academic rigor in high school, particularly in reading and writing	
Target Student:	Intermediate to advanced  9 <sup>th</sup> – 12 <sup>th</sup> graders	
Cohort Size:	95 PA I & II high schoolers (18 students earning college credits)	
Launched In:	September 2013	

# Developing Proactive Supports: Post-Graduate Institute



	Post-Graduate Institute
Description:	An intensive 6-12 month remedial, academic behavior support, and career prep program
Program Goal:	To address critical academic, social and emotional challenges before (re-)entering college
Target Student:	Primarily high school graduates that have yet to matriculate into college
Cohort Size:	20-25 students
Launched In:	September 2014
